In 2010, with support from Rob O'Neill, members of the O'Neill family established a Private Auxiliary Fund called **Pink Umbrella Foundation**. The foundation was dedicated to supporting humanitarian projects that alleviate poverty and empower people to improve their lives.

By 2024, it became clear that succession planning was essential to ensure the continuation of this work. As a result, Pink Umbrella Foundation International Limited was registered.

Pink Umbrella Foundation International Limited is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) and is endorsed as a <u>deductible gift recipient</u> (DGR1) with the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

While funding for Pink Umbrella Foundation International Limited will primarily come from the original Pink Umbrella Foundation (PUF), we do now have the capacity to accept third-party untied donations.

Pink Umbrella Foundation and Pink Umbrella Foundation International Limited have a shared Vision and Mission.

The 2024–25 year has been a transformative chapter for the Pink Umbrella Foundation. We established Pink Umbrella Foundation International Limited (PUFIL) as a registered Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) with full DGR-1 status. This milestone enables us to accept tax-deductible donations and expands our capacity to serve communities in need.

We are particularly grateful to Rob for getting our PBI over the line. His dedication, focus, and perseverance is deeply appreciated. Navigating the complexities of ATO and ACNC requirements was a task that demanded expertise and knowledge, and Rob absolutely delivered.

PUFIL has been the primary source of our grant-making activities this year, allowing us to channel resources directly into impactful programs. Meanwhile, our original entity, Pink Umbrella Foundation (our Private Ancillary Fund), continues to manage our investments and operational expenses, ensuring the sustainability of our mission.

One of our most significant achievements in 2024-25 has been the launch of Pink Tower Montessori Preschool and Teacher Training Centre in Kampala, Uganda. Under Bry's dedicated leadership, this initiative has flourished.

Our inaugural cohort comprised eight teacher trainees, and in June, our Montessori graduate teachers embarked on an enriching journey to Tanzania to begin their development as future teacher trainers.

We have also deepened our relationships with many of our longstanding beneficiaries, witnessing first hand the positive changes

Montessori

Pink Tower Montessori Preschool and Training Centre

During 2024-25 a major focus for us has been the successful establishment of Pink Tower Montessori in Kampala, a dream brought to life to provide high-quality early childhood education.

This FY we have invested heavily into this project. Much of this has gone toward one-time setup costs, ensuring not only a stimulating learning environment for our students but also comfortable on-site accommodation for our staff.

We have a great team of seven staff. Five live on the premises, while our cook and gatekeeper reside locally.

Training has been a key area of investment, and it will continue to be a major focus in the 2025–2026 financial year, as we work to strengthen the skills and confidence of our growing team.

As part of the preparations to make the space suitable for children, we undertook significant infrastructure works, including the installation of additional toilets to provide separate facilities for boys and girls. This involved professional tradies to carry out extensive work installing toilets, basins, plumbing and tiles.

Rent is our largest ongoing expense, but many of the initial costs were one-off investments. We fully furnished both the school and the residential areas, acquiring beds, bedding, classroom furniture, outdoor play items such as a sandpit and seesaw.

Our leadership team has been exceptional: Winnie is doing an outstanding job leading the academic program, while Levert provides strong oversight of all administrative operations. Their dedication and collaborative spirit have laid foundation for the culture and effectiveness of our school.

We are also proud to share that we now have 10 students enrolled, a milestone made possible in part by our decision to offer partial sponsorships, making our Montessori education more accessible to families in the community.


